“For thus says the LORD the God of Israel: The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the LORD sends rain on the earth.’ She went and did as Elijah said, so that she as well as he and her household ate for many days.”

1 Kings 17:14-15

God can, and often does, use the most unlikely people to accomplish His will. In this case, He chose a widow who was on her last scraps of food to feed His servant Elijah. Don't underestimate the impact your gift can have. The widow in this story had next to nothing, yet she was obedient to what Elijah instructed her to do. As she made bread from the last flour and oil she had, God provided for her family and for Elijah. While you may not see a miracle exactly like this one, what we learn from this passage is that our obedience makes a difference. As you prepare your tithes and offerings, think about how God may use your gift. Whose life will change? What impact will those individuals have in our community and beyond? We may not know the details on this side of eternity, but we can trust that God will use our gifts to accomplish His purposes.

In September we are collecting deodorant for our local food pantry. Please place your donated items in Mother Hubbard's Cupboard, located in the front narthex or drop them off in the church office.

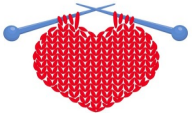
VETERANS MEMORIAL
